ILL SIR WILLARD "BILL" WHITNEY-R.I.P.

Willard F. "Bill" Whitney, 91, of Elizabethtown, PA, passed away on Monday, April 30, 2012 at Lancaster General Hospital.

He was the husband of Ruth L. Gleason Whitney, with whom he celebrated 62 years of marriage this past April 22nd. Born in Winfield, NY, he was the son of the late Willard F. and Augusta Hirt Whitney.

Bill had been with the New York City Police Dept. for 27 years until his retirement with the rank of Lieutenant in 1971. A 32 degree Mason, He was the Past Worshipful Master of Alcyone Lodge 695 in Northport, NY, the Right Worshipful District Deputy Grand Master of the Empire State Masons in New York City, NY, and the Past Potentate of Kismet Shrine of Long Island, NY. He was also an Associate Member of the Bahia Shrine in Orlando, Florida.

Bill was a graduate of the Baruch School of the City College of New York. He was a US Navy veteran of World War II, serving in the Pacific Theater.

In addition to his wife, Ruth, he is survived by his children: Willard F. married to Margaret Whitney of Wyckoff, NJ, Pamela J. married to Joseph Rakoski of Mechanicsburg, and Peter J. married to Kimberley Whitney of Charlotte, NC; his 7 granddaughters and by his 3 great grandchildren. APPLICATIONS, NO-REFERRALS, YES

From the Philadelphia Hospital: As you may have heard from previous communications from Shriners International, it is no longer necessary for families to complete an "application" in order to be considered for treatment at Shriners Hospitals for Children. In other words, we have eliminated the need to fill out a two-page form and work through a process before a patient can be considered for treatment.

Now, you or the patients themselves can simply call the hospital with a patient's information and we'll start the scheduling an appointment for them. You can:

- Tell the family to call us at 215-430-4140 or toll free 800-281-4050x4140
- · Alternatively, make the call as you're with the family, to provide more personal customer service. We will provide business cards for you to provide to the patient.

What this means for you:

When speaking to the public about how to refer a patient to our hospital, please eliminate the terminology "apply for care." Our goal is to remove the perceived barrier of "applying" for care. It is preferred to use the term "refer a patient.

H&R BLOCK DONATES FOR NEW CLIENTS

Once again, this year we have an exceptional opportunity to earn significant money for our Shriners Hospitals. H & R Block, the nation's largest and best known income tax preparation company, has again partnered with the Shriners in their Non Profit Referral Program, whereby they will donate \$25.00 to Shriners Hospitals for each *new client* that has their tax return prepared by Block and presents a coupon that requests that the donation be made. (Block defines a new client as one that did not have their taxes prepared by Block in the prior year.)

The client does not have to be affiliated with the Shrine, so the program can also be promoted among friends and relatives. Additionally, you might ask selected businesses, who are friends of the Shrine, to make the coupons available to their customers and employees.

Dear Noble.

Our *Love to the rescue* awareness campaign is in full swing and the results so far are very encouraging. Like us, you may have heard comments from patients, families and associates who have seen our ads on television or online. This anecdotal feedback informs us people are making the emotional connection we want

Since the launch of the *Love to the rescue* national media campaign on June 11, it has delivered more than 718,682,000 impressions (eyeballs) targeting adults 18+. Summarized below are the results for each medium.

National Television

- National television accounted for 385,619,000 impressions, 54% of the total impressions to date.
- Love to the rescue has aired on 24 national cable networks including large, broad-based (BET, TBS, TNT and USA), satellite clusters (Dish and Direct TV) and some specifically targeting women 25+ (Bravo, El, HGTV, Lifetime, Oxygen, Style and We).

Digital Display

- Digital display ads generated 297,144,000 impressions, 41% of the total impressions to date.
- Love to the rescue banners appeared on 50+ digital sites, reaching target audiences including moms, upscale viewers and women 25+.

Online Search

- Online search delivered 24,697,000 impressions, 5% of the total impressions to date.
- Shriners Hospitals for Children website visits are up 87% and unique visits are up 90% from last year.

These numbers clearly meet the *Love to the rescue* campaign's objective of increasing awareness of our organization by tell our compelling story. In January 2013, we will conduct a follow-up study to gauge the increase in awareness of Shriners Hospitals for Children. We fully expect to have made significant progress in developing the public's knowledge of us and the work we do. This will ultimately lead to more donations to support our mission of providing the highest quality, specialized care regardless of a patient's ability to pay.

We will continue to update you periodically on our media performance and campaign results. Thank you for supporting this very important initiative.


