MASONIC EDUCATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The Grand Lodge of New York through its Trustees of the Masonic Hall and Asylum established a scholarship in 1996. The Education Assistance Committee of Grand Lodge administers this scholarship program for post high school level students. The effort is directed at the sons, daughters, grandsons and granddaughters of Master Masons in good standing, belonging to Lodges within the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of New York. Awards totaling over \$10 million have been made thus far, based upon academic achievement, community involvement and financial need.

Over the weekend of July 13th and 14th, the EAP committee traveled to Upstate New York (Utica, Rochester and Syracuse) to give out these awards to students. Over the weekend of August 3rd and 4th additional awards will be given out in the Grand Lodge building in NYC and Schenectady. The Grand Master of Masons, M.'.W.'. James Sullivan was in attendance to make the presentations personally.

Applications for scholarship assistance are available from all Lodge Secretaries, District Deputy Grand Masters and may be downloaded from the Empire State Mason web site, www.ESMason.com. Scholarships are awarded according to academic

excellence and the students' involvement in their communities. Award presentations to the recipients are made at central locations within the four regions of New York State. EPIPHANY YOUTHS HELP SHRINERS WITH TAB DRIVE

Years ago, one of Beth Donofrio's middle school students accidentally set himself on fire while making an explosion for his G.I. Joe action figure.

He was burned down his back, all the way to his feet.

When Donofrio found out, the Shriners flew the boy and his mother to their Children's Hospital in Cincinnati free of charge and provided care to him for four months until he could return to school.

Donofrio decided to help in some small way out of gratitude to the organization. Each year, Epiphany Cathedral School collects soda can pull-tabs to donate to the Shriners in Sarasota.

The Shriners recycle the tabs for about 55 cents a pound and then use the money at the Shriners Hospital for Children in Tampa.

This year, Epiphany collected 110 pounds of aluminum tabs to benefit the Wheel-chair Repair Fund.

To date, Sarasota Shriners have collected 89,199 pounds of tabs and aluminum (\$45,917.87).

In addition to modifying children's custom wheelchairs, which must be adjusted about every six months as the child grows, the money from the tabs has helped the Shriners build a new playground consisting of recycled tires.

MaryLou Ellis, the pull-tab chairwoman, and her husband, Fred, who also is a member of the Shriners, collect all of the tabs from various organizations and store them at their home in Venice.

Ellis visits the schools to speak to children about the Wheelchair Repair Fund and the children it helps.

She writes a certificate of appreciation for each organization she visits.

Once the tabs are at their home, Fred pulls a magnet through a 100-pound barrel of tabs, eliminating anything that sticks; that separates steel from aluminum.

After collecting about 300 pounds of tabs, a truck is loaded and dispatched to to the recycling center in Sarasota.

Since the school's participation in the program began, Epiphany has had two students benefit directly from the Tampa Shriners Children's Hospital, which provides orthopedic care to its patients.

At the bottom of Marylou Ellis' letter thanking Epiphany for its donation, she wrote, "Every single tab helps a child in need in our shrine hospitals."

To help Epiphany break its record of 110 pounds of tabs collected, you can drop off donations at the school office, 316 Sarasota St., Venice, in care of Donofrio.

EL JEBEL SHRINE DONATION DRIVE BENEFITS KIDS WITH SEVERE DISEASE



North Denver community member, the El Jebel Shrine, is holding two fundraising events in June. A used household items drive in partnership with Goodwill Industries on June 28-30 and a black tie event on June 22. Both events will raise money for the Shriners Hospital Patient Transportation Fund in order to provide free travel for the patient and a family member to one of the 22 Shriners Hospitals for Children.

These specialized hospitals offer health care services, regardless of the patients' ability to pay, to children under the age of 18 who are suffering from orthopedic birth defects, severe burns, spinal cord injuries, and cleft palettes, to name a few. This international health care system also provides innovative research and outstanding teaching programs for specialty pediatric care. According to Mike Trevathan, High Priest and Prophet, (a key member of the

organization's Board of Director's with exotic titles) "We had our 1 millionth child come through our doors last year. You do not have to be part of the Shriners to benefit from this care. The only requirement is that the child is under the age of 18, with a condition that we believe we can help."

Readers can help these children by bringing donations to the El Jebel Shrine Center located at 4625 West 50th Avenue on Friday, June 28 through Sunday June 30 from 9:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. Goodwill trailers will be on hand to haul away your belongings. Tax receipts for donations will be available. Trevathan notes, "Goodwill is looking for the following items. Clothing, shoes, linens, furniture in good condition, sporting equipment, toys, housewares, jewelry, books, small appliances, computers, fax machines, cell phones and electronics. They cannot take mattresses, large appliances, engines or building materials such as wood, cement, chemicals, plastic pipe, or scrap metal."

In addition to the Goodwill donation drive, El Jebel Shriners 125th Anniversary celebration will be held on June 22. It is the first annual benefit for the Shriners Hospitals for Children. This black tie evening with charity auction will raise money for the El Jebel Hospital transportation fund, as well. The cost is \$150 couples/\$75 for singles. MARY SWICKARD — CHAMPION FOR CHILDREN

If anyone exemplifies the spirit of our Love to the rescue theme, it's Mary Swickard of Los Alamos, New Mexico. A former

retailer in the shoe industry, Mary was reflecting on her good fortune and contemplating how to share her estate with charities that would help children. Mary was speaking with her friend Sybil Shook who's brother Hal "Bud" Martin was a Shriner in the Salt Lake City, Utah area.

"I was working on my estate planning and wanted to donate a condominium I owned in Albuquerque. A dear friend Sybil suggested I consider the Shriners Hospitals for Children. My curiosity about their work was piqued, so I phoned Bud and his wife Ann who volunteered at the Shriners Hospital in Salt Lake City." The Martins' devotion to the Shriners Hospitals was so powerful that Mary knew she was connecting with an organization that shared her passion for helping children in need.

The Martins convinced Mary to visit the Shriners Hospital for Children in Salt Lake City to see the mission in action. When she arrived at the hospital for her tour Mary said she "was kind of choked up, seeing the children." During the visit,

a screening of the Shriners Hospitals Patient Ambassadors video was the turning point "when they showed me the video I could barely keep my tears back, the work they do with the children is amazing."

A technician at the hospital who manufactures and fits the patients for their prosthetic devices explained how the child would need to be refitted many times before reaching adulthood. Mary shared that she never realized what a long-term commitment the Shriners Hospitals make to the children they serve and the tremendous expense associated with this endeavor. This was the defining moment; Mary was all-in.

Upon returning to her home in New Mexico, Mary connected with Donor Development and began work creating a life estate. In addition to generous cash gifts, Mary elected to donate her present home to the Shriners Hospitals for Children. The agreement includes a provision where she continues to reside in the home until her passing. Over the next six -years, she will also enjoy a graduated tax deduction resulting from the property donation.

Mary said she "was thrilled at how professionally the Shriners organization handled the real estate transaction." She added, "I am proud to share these gifts with a hospital system that does so much great work for children who may not otherwise have a chance in life."

sticks.


