On July 27th at the Board Meeting, Mohammed Khan, PhD spoke to the group about "Burn-induced Inflammation and Muscle Atrophy."

Summary

Inflammation and muscle atrophy are the two major pathophysiological problems that occur in burned patients during hospitalization. Our study utilizes mice models of major and minor burn injury to study systemic and local inflammation, respectively. In addition, our study also investigates muscle atrophy using hindlimb immobilization-induced muscle disuse model as well as a local burn-induced model by superimposing it with hindlimb immobilization model. Our main focus of research is to see the effects of a burn injury or hindlimb immobilization on spleen or liver damage and loss of skeletal muscle mass, respectively, which are considered to be caused by hyperactivation and infiltration of macrophages/monocytes (immune cells). We target nicotinic acetylcholine receptor (α 7AChR) in macrophages by its specific agonist, GTS-21, to reverse the burn-induced inflammation spleen and liver damage, and hindlimb immobilization-induced muscle atrophy. Our data showed that GTS-21 stimulation of α 7AChR in macrophages inhibits burn-induced inflammation as well as hindlimb immobilization-induced muscle atrophy. These findings will lead to understanding the role of macrophages and mechanisms in burn-induced inflammation and hindlimb immobilization-induced organ damage, leading to the development of therapeutic measures, which can be translated to burned patients.

Boilerplate for Shriners Hospitals for Children

Generally, care is provided until age 18, although, in some cases, it may be extended to age 21. All care and services are provided in a family-centered environment. 
